2022 Annual Banquet Highlights

Joe Humphreys honoring Ed Shenk

Joe Humphreys provided a heartfelt tribute to his good friend Ed Shenk known as the 'Master of the Letort.' Ed was one of the Letort Regulars that helped start the heritage of spring creek fly fishing. Ed was inducted in the Catskill Fly Fishing Center's Hall of Fame in 2012.



Al Caucci - Museum Honoree

Al Caucci has been an international name in the fly fishing world since his milestone book HATCHES was presented in the Field & Stream Book of the month Club in May 1975. Al created the famous COMPARADUN in 1966 and developed other well known patterns in the early '70s. Al's name is synonymous with modern fly fishing entomology.



Chuck Furimsky - Museum Honoree

Chuck Furimsky is one of the founders of the 'Fly Fishing Show' and spent 30+ years dedicated to promoting Fly Fishing and Fly Tying here in Pennsylvania and around the country. During the banquet he shared multiple stories on how he got started in Fly Fishing and highlights from Fly Fishing shows over the years.
