Did You Know: It was 46 years ago, September 7, 1963, that Trout Unlimited held its First Annual National Convention at the Allenberry Resort on the fabled Yellow Breeches near the picturesque town of Boiling Spring, PA. PFFMA has the transcripts from that first convention.

Many of the issues discussed at this first national convention are still with us today—need for stream improvement, special regulations, wild trout versus hatchery or "artificial trout", as some called them, hooking mortality, barbless hooks, the legitimate role of TU, the role of science and the need for political action, emphasis on sport rather than harvest, the aesthetic value of trout fishing, fishing for fun and throughout, an emphasis on fly-fishing.
